Minor: What if I'll buy one for my father?

Manager: Still we don't allow it that way.

Minor: How about me giving an authorization letter for my

father?

Manager: You must be kidding.

Grammar Focus "would"

"Would" is most commonly used to create conditional verb forms.

It also serves as the past form of the modal verb "will."

Additionally, "would" can indicate repetition in the past.
