Future Perfect Tense

RULES AND EXAMPLES

IMPORTANT No Future in Time Clauses

Like all future forms, the Future Perfect cannot be used in clauses beginning with "when," "while," "before," "after," "by the time," "as soon as," "if" and "unless". In this lesson, all verbs in Time Clauses are italicized.

NOUN/PRONOUN + [AM / IS / ARE] + [GOING TO HAVE] + [PAST PARTICIPLE]

EXAMPLE:

I am going to have perfected my English by the time I come back from the US.

NOTE: It is possible to use either "will" or "going to" to create the Future Perfect with little or no difference in meaning.

Future Perfect Tense

Completed Action Before Something in the Future

The Future Perfect expresses the idea that something will occur before another action in the future. It can also show that something will happen before a specific time in the future.

EXAMPLES:

1. *By next November, I will have received my promotion.*
2. *By the time he gets home, she is going to have cleaned the entire house.*

ACTIVE / PASSIVE Past Perfect

EXAMPLES:

1. *The Post Office will have returned my package before I can pick it up.*

ACTIVE

2. *My package will have been returned by the Post Office before I can pick it up.*

PASSIVE
