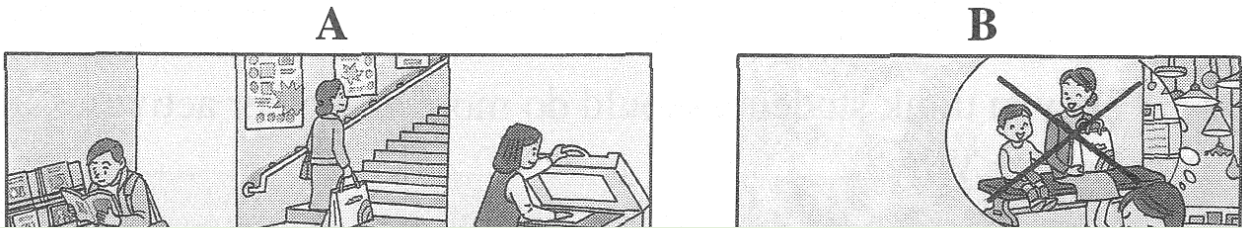


## Electronic Dictionaries
