1. Security /sɪˈkjʊər.ɪ.ti/

(noun) freedom from danger; safety; the feeling of being confident in one's family and relationships; an investment in a company or in government debt that can be traded on the financial markets

Ex.: The security in the government offices is not very good.

2. job security /ˈdʒɑːb sɪˈkjʊər.ə.ti/

(noun) the probability that an individual will keep his or her job

Ex.: Their pay was low and they had no job security or legal rights.

3. Financial security

(noun) refers to the peace of mind you feel when you aren't worried about your income being enough to cover your expenses. It also means that you have enough money saved to cover emergencies and your future financial goals.

Ex.: We need financial security.

4. social security

(noun) public provision for the economic, and sometimes social, welfare of the aged, unemployed, etc., esp. through pensions and other monetary assistance

Ex.: They are living on a social security.

(noun) ability to protect itself from the threat of violence or attack.

Ex. We must deal with threats to our national security regardless of the cost.

8. Data security

(noun) refers to protective digital privacy measures that are applied to prevent unauthorized access to computers, databases and websites.

Ex.: Most companies secure their profiles and documents through data security.

Useful Expressions

Ex.: A good education is a security against unemployment.

2. **lull someone into a false sense of security - lead someone into believing that all is well before attacking or doing someone bad**
