Useful Expressions

1 **To make friends (with sb) : to become a friend of someone.**

Ex. I want to make friends with all the people in my company.

2 **BFF : This means “best friends forever” and is a slang way to say that someone is your very good friend.**

Ex. Sara and Sally are BFFs. They go everywhere together.

3 **to have something in common : share the same interests or personality**

Ex. My best friend and I love dogs. That is what we have in common.
