
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I have brown hair.	She has long hair.	They have short hair.

Noun + 's = possessive or is?	
's = possessive	's = is
Cindy's name. = Her name. Mark's house. = His house.	My name's Cindy. = My name is Cindy. Mark's nice. = Bob is nice. Who's English? = Who is English?
The hotel's name's The Nara Hotel. = Its name is the Nara .
