### Likes and Dislikes

#### Do you like ...?

To talk about liking or disliking something, you can use verb + -ing with: -



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|                                     |                 |                |
|-------------------------------------|-----------------|----------------|
| Do you <b><i>hate</i></b> football? | Yes, I hate it. | No, I love it. |
|-------------------------------------|-----------------|----------------|

To invite someone to do something, you can use verb + -ing with: -





**feel like | fancy**

Asking and answering questions: -

| Question  | Answer +          | Answer -                  |
|---|-------------------|---------------------------|
| Do you <b><i>feel like</i></b> going out tonight? | Yes, I'd love to. | No, I don't feel like it. |
| Do you <b><i>fancy</i></b> going for a drive?     | Yes, I'd love to. | No, I don't feel like it. |

## Love – Hate (emphatic verbs – expresses strong emotion or feelings)

After some verbs (love, like, don't/doesn't mind, hate) you can use a noun, a pronoun or a verb +ing.

|                                |  |  |                   |  |
|--------------------------------|--|--|-------------------|--|
|                                | <b>Love</b><br> | <b>Like</b><br> | <b>Don't mind</b> | <b>Hate</b><br> |
| <b>Noun</b><br><b>(coffee)</b> | I love tea.  | I like tea.  | I don't mind tea. | I hate tea.  |

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To invite someone to do something you can also use: -

| Question                                 | Answer +           | Answer -                  |
|--|--------------------|---------------------------|
| <i>How about going out</i> tonight?      | Yes, I'd love to.  | No, I don't feel like it. |
| <i>Would you like to go out</i> tonight? | Yes, I'd love to.  | No, I don't feel like it. |
| <i>How about having</i> a drink?         | Yes, I'd love to.  | No, thanks.               |
| <i>Would you like to have</i> a drink?   | Yes, I'd love one. | No, thank you.            |

**!** **Remember:** 'How about ...' is informal. 'Would you like to ...' is formal.

*Now let's see how Mr Nato does it...*

*Mr Nato is at home when his wife comes in...*

| Mr Nato:  | <i>Hello, darling. Do you fancy going out tonight?</i>                                       |
| Mrs Nato: | <i>Oh, no thanks, I don't really feel like it tonight. How about renting a film instead.</i> |
| Mr Nato:  | <i>OK. Do you feel like watching the new Bruce Willis film, Die Hard 13?</i>                 |

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
