Over the last twelve months, we evaluated twenty-seven properties, including schools, libraries, and government offices. The data shows a 12% reduction in overall energy usage compared to the previous year, largely due to improved insulation and upgraded HVAC systems. The Jefferson Library, in particular, was our biggest success—cutting energy consumption by nearly 20%. These results confirm that targeted improvements in older buildings can yield significant benefits without requiring full renovations.
